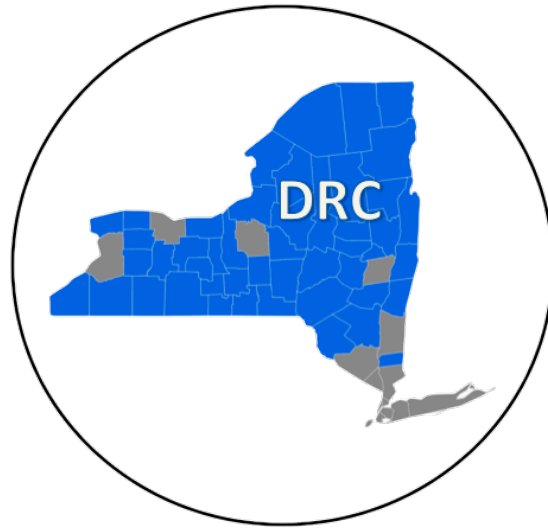


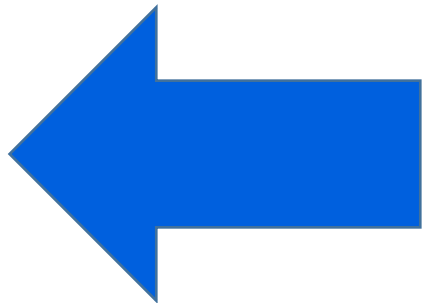
Here's the plan:

Your County Committee gathers a list of Democratic voters who tend to vote in presidential years but not in other elections.

You as a County Committee member take responsibility for 10 of these voters. If possible, these will be voters in your own districts and neighborhoods.



With a little bit of effort, we can make the 2018 election the kind of success we all know is out there if we work for it. Let's bring the #BlueTsunami to DRC Country!

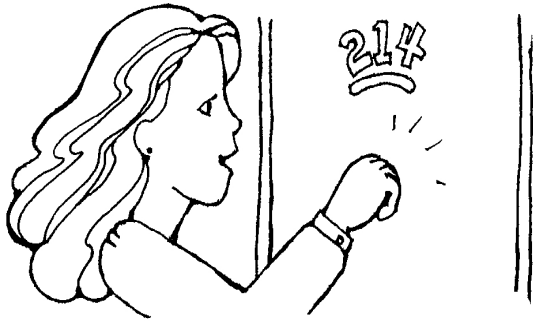

Step 1:

Soon after Labor Day, reach out to all 10 or your voters with a quick personal visit or letter.



Introduce yourself to all 10 voters. Let them know what's going on with your county committee and local campaigns. Do you have an event coming up? Make sure to invite them.

Step 2:

In early October contact your 10 voters again.



Call or visit. Update your voters on local campaigns. Answer any questions you can about candidates. Offer to put them in touch with campaigns if they seem interested. Stress the importance of their vote in November!

Step 3:

Call or write your 10 voters one final time in the last 10 days before the election.



Make sure your voters know where to vote and have a plan of when and how they'll get to the polls on Election Day. Let them know who to call if they need a ride to go vote. Finally, make sure each voter knows how important their vote is to the well-being of their community and their country!
