### Conference Committee - Jane Dodds

### Issues Committee - John Hurley

Highlights of the presentation in Putnam County by former Assemblyman Richard Brodsky;

- 1. History of economic development in NY State Empire Zones, public benefit corporations, re-charge NY, etc.
- 2. Need for overhaul of regulations that hold corporations accountable.
- 3. Severe lack of compliance with statute that requires their activity be tied to job creation.
- 4. Oversight and accountability through investigations, FOIA and new regulations.
- 5. In conclusion he spoke in great length for the need of a NY State constitutional convention which would cover issues like IDA reform, charter schools, Forever Wild, Board of Regents, prevailing wage, women's health issues, state pensions, etc. He encouraged the DRC to take up a discussion at our 2017 Conference in Syracuse.

### Communications Committee – Judith Hunter

We had a very busy convention, given the media attention surrounding President Clinton's appearance. Our efforts were hampered in part by a lack of press contacts in some upstate regions.
