#### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

As 2017 has drawn to a close, we see the opportunity for a Democratic sweep from Congress to the Senate to our NYS leadership statewide and in both Legislative Houses. #### Information about Board responsibilities:

1) Directors meet in person three or four times a year and hold about as many telephone conference call meetings per year.

2) This is a working Board. Directors are expected to join at least one committee (Issues, By-Laws, Finance, Communications/Outreach, Political, Youth Recruitment and Retention and other ad hoc committees as needed).

3) A board member who misses three consecutive Executive Committee meetings is automatically removed from the board per the by-laws.
